CVSS in the news

- "11 Poly Grads win places in local medical schools this year" (ST, 9 Aug) Two of our former students (Peh Ting Yong, class of 2011 and Sylvia Phua, class of 2013) are among the 11 local poly grads who have scored places in the NUS Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine. Ting Yong applied to study medicine at NUS in 2015 but was rejected. However, his time as a combat medic during NS made him more certain that he wanted to be a doctor. He applied again this year and was successful. This is a fine example of our students' grit in pursuing their passion.
- "Using Big Data to Improve Study Space" (ST, 28 Aug) The National Science Experiment Big Data Challenge organised by the National Research Foundation seeks to help participants understand big data and its application to manage real-world issues. 77 Sec 1 students volunteered to take part in the experiment by wearing an ambient sensor for a week and 5 Sec 3 students followed up with analysing the data and researched on the classroom conditions affecting students' concentration. The challenge involved more than 400 students from 45 schools and our students' project caught the interest of the ST reporters.

Highlights of School Events/Programmes in Term 3

- Annual Cross Country We finally had good weather for our annual cross country after 3 years and students and teachers had a good race at MacRitchie Reservoir Park on 21 Jul.
- National Day celebration We had a 'fly-past' of national flag by a drone. 12 NCC(Air) cadets and 24 band members also took part in the annual Sengkang Central PAYM Loves Red National Day Observance Ceremony held at Sengkang CC on 6 Aug. The cadets put up a freestyle and precision skill performance while the band played a number of national songs.
- Teachers' Day celebration We had a fun-filled and meaningful celebration on 30 Aug with the theme of "Teachers as Transformers Transforming education and inspiring lives". The day began with all classes preparing their tokens of appreciation for teachers and followed by a concert with energetic performances by band, choir, dance and drama CCAs and a touching song item by alumni members. All form teachers were affirmed for their important roles in shaping students' lives while dressed in their favourite transformers costumes and there was also a special tribute to long serving teachers in the school. The celebrations ended with cutting of cake sponsored by the PSG and reciting of Teachers Pledge by all teachers, led by the Principal.

- Hosting of China Twinning Schools Our school hosted 51 students and 7 teachers from SIP Xinggang School and Changshu Foreign Language Junior High School from Suzhou on 20 & 21 Jul. The Chinese students attended normal and special lessons with student buddies while the Chinese teachers observed a Biology practical lesson by our HOD/Science. The visitors also took part in our Racial Harmony Day activities including an assembly talk and traditional food fair. In return, we will be visiting both schools at the end of the year as part of the performing arts cum cultural immersion trip to Suzhou/Hangzhou/Shanghai.
- Visit by Director-General of Education Mr Wong Siew Hoong visited our school on 11 Sep to find out more about Professional Learning Community practices in schools since MOE started the initiative in 2010. We have established a culture of collaboration among teachers, open classrooms through peer observations and teacher ownership in professional learning. The visit is a strong recognition of our school efforts and strengths in staff professional development.
- North East CDC Community Learning Journey 12 Sec 3 student volunteers from various CCAs helped out with managing a community toy library at Beacon RC and digitising records at Workspace@Sengkang CC over 4 weeks. The programme is part of NECDC Community Employment Programme (CEP) and aims to provide students a better understanding of various NECDC programmes and the social experience of involving in authentic community work. Students were matched to one CEP beneficiary, learn about the job scope and assist in their work, and thereby develop good citizenry and social responsibility.
- North East CDC G!nnovation In alignment with our Sec 2 Green Compass Programme, 12 Sec 2 student volunteers took part in this event which is a platform for schools in the North East district to propose, develop and test trial environmentally-friendly and sustainable projects. Our students set up a recycled paper making interactive booth and showcased upcycled artefacts.
- Inaugural CVSS Alumni Homecoming Day Our Alumni EXCO organised the first Alumni Homecoming Day on 1 July with the theme of "Reunite!" The event received strong support from more than 200 former students from 16 batches who took part in activities such as Captain's Ball matches, live singing and watercolour painting workshop conducted by a former student.
