### **Arrival and Dismissal Times**

All students will report to school on Tue 4 Jan. The arrival/d dismissal times remain staggered for students:

- Students should proceed straight to their form classrooms as usual. Students can refer to notices at the classroom blocks for their newly allocated classrooms for 2022. Flag-raising in the classrooms will start at 7.40am sharp. Students who arrive after 7.30am (Sec 3/4/5), 7.35am (Sec 2) and 7.40am (Sec 1) will be considered late. All latecomers will report to the student management team at the foyer.
- There may be early school dismissal on some days for various reasons in the year. Students should inform their parents as and when necessary. Some classes may have different regular dismissal times on certain days. Details of arrival/d dismissal times, recess, after school lessons and CCAs are provided in Annex A: Student Daily Routines.
- Due to the continued need to wear face masks at all times, students may still attend school in PE attire for better comfort or half/full school uniform if they wish, unless otherwise advised.
- Sec 1s are reminded to report to the canteen first on the first day of school where they will inform the student councillors on duty of their classes, who will then lead them to their form classroom.
- Parents who drive their children to school are reminded to drop their children off at the recommended drop off point at the roundabout between HDB Block 296A and 296B.

### **Safe Management Measures**

- Students who are unwell or have a positive ART result should not report to school. They should follow MOH's Protocols 1 and 2 respectively. Students placed on Health Risk Warning (HRW) should follow MOH's Protocol 3 and ensure they have a valid negative ART result before going to school.
- In view of the recent development of Omicron COVID-19 variant, parents who had travelled are reminded to submit an updated travel declaration to the school, if there is any change to their travel plan, by Mon 3 Jan.
- Parents are not allowed to enter the school compound or remain in school for the time being.
- Once-daily temperature taking – Please remind your children to bring their personal thermometers to school daily for temperature-taking during the morning routine. While temperature screening is no longer required in public premises, screening for fever/flu-like symptoms remains an important measure by MOE to keep our schools safe.
- As contact tracing is based on TraceTogether (TT) Tokens, all students are to carry their TT tokens with them at all times. Parents may collect TT tokens for their children from any Community Centre/Club. Singaporeans and Permanent Residents who are collecting their tokens for the first time can also request for the TT token to be delivered via post. ### **Communication Channels with Parents**

- We value home-school partnership. To facilitate communications, we have provided email addresses of all form teachers and key personnel in Annex B (Staff Contact List). Parents may also contact teachers through the general office during school hours. However, teachers may not be able to respond immediately or may only be able to respond on the next working day. We would like to emphasize that a trusting and respectful relationship between schools and parents includes respecting teachers' personal time and space. Hence teachers are not expected to respond to parents'/students' queries during weekends except for emergencies. Teachers are also not expected to provide their personal phone number to parents. Communication channels with parents will also include Parents Gateway and the school website.
- We have scheduled a Meet-the-Form-Teachers (MTFT) on 26 and 27 May for all levels. You will have the opportunity to discuss the progress of your child/ward with the form/co-form teachers to support the learning of your child/ward. Details will be given nearer the date.

## **Back to School Programme**

To help students ease back into school and start the year on a right footing, we have planned this programme for all students except Sec 1s on the first day of school (4 Jan). The programme includes going through a start of term check-in package provided by MOE Guidance Branch, setting expectations and routines for learning and taking charge of one's growth, and class bonding activities to build positive student-student and teacher-student relationships. Students will be dismissed at 1.35pm (Sec 2), 1.40pm (Sec 3) and 1.45pm (Sec 4/5).

## **2022 Sec 1 Cohort, Orientation Programme (4-6 Jan), CCA Open House and Parents' Talk (14 Jan)**

We have been posted 4 Express, 3 Normal (Academic) and 1 Normal (Technical) classes. 82.6% of our Sec 1 students chose CVSS as their first three choices. The Cut-Off-Points based on the new PSLE scoring system are 19, 24 and 27 respectively. We have taken in 11 students under Direct School Admission under STEM-Aeronautics, Softball and Floorball. Sec 1 parents are reminded to refer to the info package sent out to all Sec 1 parents on 22 Dec for details on the above programmes organised for Sec 1 students.

## **New 2-Weekly (Odd/Even) Timetabling Structure**

- As part of MOE's ongoing efforts to customise learning to each student's needs and develop multiple pathways for success, Full Subject Based Banding (FSBB) will be implemented in most secondary schools by 2024. Students from the Express, Normal(Academic), and Normal(Technical) streams will be merged into a single course of study, with customisation at the subject level, beyond the 4 PSLE subjects currently offered under Subject-Based Banding at present.
- Our school will be implementing FSBB in 2023. In preparation for this and to overcome timetabling constraints, we will be adopting a two-weekly (instead of the usual weekly) timetable from 2022 onwards. Students will have their lessons spread over 10 days instead of 5 days. The class timetables has been shared with your child/ward via the school website. A two-weekly timetable will also provide more flexibility and capacity in the curriculum for our students to have a richer learning experience.

## **Blended Learning (BL) and Personalised Digital Learning Programme (PDLP)**

- To prepare students to be self-directed, collaborative and digitally skilled to navigate an increasingly digitalized world, we have embarked on BL/PDLP for all levels since Semester 2, 2021. With BL, students will learn curriculum content through a mix of in-school and home-based activities, online and offline.
- Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days - To promote self-directed learning and exploration to complement classroom learning, we have scheduled 7 HBL days for all students (except HBL Day 7 for Sec 1 & 3 only) as follows. On HBL Days, students need **NOT** report to school. Instructions for students and lesson packages will be provided later.

- Personal Learning Device (PLD) - Sec 2 to 4 students have been issued a PLD last year. More details on the issuance of PLDs to Sec 1s will be communicated at a later date. Learning with a PLD enables students to engage in self-directed learning, and learn together with their peers. It also provides an immersive environment for students to acquire digital skills. Students will undergo a series of SLS lessons on New Media Literacies, which would help them make good use of their PLDs for learning. It is students' responsibility to take good care of their PLDs. Details on the management and care of students' PLDs may be found in our 2022 Student Companion, pp. 27-28. Your child/ward's PLD is installed with a Device Management Application (DMA) to provide a safer digital learning environment for learning. You will be able to monitor your child's/ward's PLD activities, via the DMA Parent Portal, and partner the school to ensure his/her cyber well-being. More information on the DMA and the Parent Portal will be provided via Parents Gateway in Jan 2022.
- Parents/guardians play an active role in partnering us to help your child/ward navigate the digital environment, so that they can thrive in an increasingly interconnected, diverse and rapidly changing world. MOE and CVSS will continue to share more digital parenting tips through our communication channels.
- As all secondary school students will own a PLD from 2022, secondary school students will no longer be eligible to apply for the IMDA's NEU PC Plus programme with effect from 1 Jan 2022. IMDA will consider appeals by Sec 5 students to apply for NEU PC Plus on a case by case basis.

## **School and National Examinations 2022**

- In line with MOE's policies and guidelines on school-based assessments, there are no Mid-Year Examinations (MYE) for Sec 1 and 3 to allow students to adjust to new subjects and higher curricular demands at these key transition stages. At all levels, students receive regular feedback on their learning through termly Weighted Assessments (WA). Our school-based assessments are complemented with effective pedagogies to deepen students' learning, which will encourage self-directed learning and strengthen holistic development.
- The schedules of our school and national examinations and the school's WA, as well as the weighting of our school exams and WA are given in Annexes C1 (School and National Examinations Schedule), C2 (WA Schedule) and C3 (Assessment Weighting for School Examinations),

## **2021 GCE 'N' Level Exam Results**

Our students have done better than 2020 cohort. 85.2% of 4NA students are eligible for promotion to 5NA (above the national figure of 79.2%), with at least 20% qualifying for the Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP). All of our NT students are eligible for admission into ITE. Many top performing students are also all-rounders who have held leadership positions in class or CCA. We also have students who have done well despite difficult circumstances. More details may be found on our school website. 'O' Level results will be released between 12 and 14 Jan 2022.

## **Key Staff Changes**

Mrs Jacqueline Tang has been posted to our school as VP(EO) wef 15 Dec 2021, replacing Ms Jacelyn Kee posted to MOE HQ as Deputy Director/Music & Art, Arts Education Branch. Ms Tay Siew Woon is appointed SH/Project Work while Mrs Preeti Kulkarni is re-designated SH/Biology.

## **School/Staff/Student Achievements in Term 4/2021**

- **Annual Singapore Environment Council-Starhub Schools Green Awards** – Our school was awarded the highest Vanda Miss Joaquim Sustained Achievement Award for excellence in environmental education. This award is given to schools which have achieved the Vanda Miss Joaquim Award for 3 consecutive years. More than 400 schools took part in the award submissions.
- **Mrs Winnie Lim, ST/Food & Nutrition** – Association of Academy of Singapore Teachers award for contributions to professional development in the teaching fraternity
- **Ms Leow Deng Li, CL teacher** – Facilitator of Workshop Award by Academy of Singapore Teachers (AST) for contributions to Teacher-Led workshops organised by AST
- **Mr Fauwaz Nurhelmy**, Overall teacher i/c of NPCC – promotion to Assistant Superintendent of Police (NPCC) and NPCC Service Award (5 years)
- **MOE Teaching Scholarship/Awards** – 3 of our former students were given the awards this year. They are Nur Jasmine Bte Roslan (Education Merit Scholarship, the highest tier award. She was also our Outstanding North Star awardee of her cohort), Poey Xuan Ru (Teaching Scholarship, Local) and Nurismah Dewi Bte Ismail (Teaching Award). We are heartened that some of our best students have followed their teachers' footsteps and taken up teaching as their career to educate the next generation of students.
- **Singapore Youth Science Fair 2021** organised by Science Teachers Association of Singapore – 2 teams of our students won an Accomplishment award and a Commendation Award, out of 58 projects submitted. The Accomplishment award team (Tejas Mundru, Mandy Teo, Tan Jia Huui, Isaiah Kelvin Tan, Daniel Lee, all from 2E5) investigated the suitability of different materials for use in a thermoelectric generator while the Commendation award team (Lim Liang Jun, Christabelle Tan, Emily Lin, Tear Sheng Tian, all from 2E4) investigated the efficacy of greywater as an electrolyte to generate electricity.
- **19<sup>th</sup> Elementz Science Competition** organised by Anderson Secondary School – The same 2 award winning teams in the Singapore Youth Science Fair above achieved a Gold and Silver award respectively in the lower secondary category out of 35 projects submitted in this competition. Our Gold awardees were the only team in the lower secondary category invited to share their project which can be viewed at <https://youtu.be/i4yg4exOQKA>
- **11<sup>th</sup> Singapore Junior Chemistry Olympiad** organised by Singapore National Institute of Chemistry – 4 out of 6 of our student participants achieved various awards in this competition open to all upper secondary students in Singapore. The students are Hadriel Lim 4E3 (Silver), Taha Jalil 4E3 (Silver), Lin Xin Yan 4E4 (Bronze) and Kuan Jonas 4E3 (Merit). Xin Yan is particularly remarkable as she was taking combined science subject combination but showed great determination and commitment to the competition in working extremely hard outside curriculum hours on her own to catch up with the rest of the pure Chemistry students. The other two participants were Chloe Tan 4E3 and Ho Nhat Tien 4E4.
- **Singapore Polytechnic Young Engineers Award** – 7 Sec 3 students were presented with the awards for having performed very well in their Advanced Elective Module in Fundamentals of Robot Programme in March. The students are Anee Kirsten 3E2, Reine Chiang 3E2, Kristee Tan 3E3, Amber Lee 3E5, Chin Li On 3E5, Tan Dao Jun 3E5 and Tan Kwan Wei 3E5. They will be given conditional offers during the polytechnic Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) in SP-Electrical & Electronic Engineering courses in June 2022.
- **Singapore Mathematical Olympiad** organised by Singapore Mathematical Society – 15 Sec 2 and 10 Sec 4 students took part in the Junior and Senior Section respectively. 5 of them achieved Honourable Mention (Bjorn Lim 2E4, Keanan Lee 2E4, Isaiah Kelvin Tan 2E5, Mundru Tejas 2E5, Kevan Moh 4E3)

- **4<sup>th</sup> Text Recital Competition** organised by the Committee to Promote Chinese Language Learning (CPCLL) in collaboration with Anderson Primary School and Singapore Chinese Teachers Literary Recital Society – Our students clinched a Bronze award in the lower secondary team category (Li Weixiao, Deenise Tan, Derek Looi, all from 1E4) and a Bronze award in the lower secondary individual category (Linda Ng 2N2). This year's competition attracted a record of more than 1500 students from about 190 schools, with close to 900 video entries.
- **National Create Your Own Newspaper Competition** jointly organised by the Committee to Promote Chinese Language Learning (CPCLL), SPH Chinese Student Paper Zbcomma and Xinmin Secondary School – 2 teams of our students won the 3<sup>rd</sup> position for lower and upper secondary category respectively. Our upper sec team (Tang Lai Wan 3E3, Chow Jun An 3E4, Berline Tan 3E4, Cherie Liu 3E4, Toh Jia Hui 3E5) wrote an article on one of our students who is passionate about cosplay while our lower sec team (Choo Li Rui 2E3, Gerven Ong 2E3, Seck Jian Ling 2E3, Thien Jia Xuan 2E4, Shannel Ng 2E1) wrote an article on an urban farmer in Singapore.
- **“Saya Boleh Mengarang” Essay Writing Competition** organised by Edufront Learning Centre Pte Ltd – 6 essays written by our Sec 1-3 students clinched various awards from Bronze to Gold with Distinction. The students were Muhd Syazwan 1E1 and Alya Irdina 2N2 (Gold with Distinction); Nur Akid Rayyan 3N2 (Silver); Naurah Aniqah, 1N3, Aina Adriana 3N2 and Adnan Shah 4E4 (Bronze)
- **Kembara Nusa Magazine** published by Edufront Learning Centre – Ilham Yusuf 5N2's expository essay on the harmfulness of technology was featured in the April edition of this magazine that the school subscribes annually. The magazine aims to promote Malay literary writing among the young generation.
- **Historical Scene Investigation Challenge** organised by MOE CPPD/NLB – Our team of 3 students (Deenise Tan, Koh Siew Leng and Kristian Belinski, all from 1E4) won a Silver award among 80 participating school teams. Participants were to conduct research on a historical event/character that impacted on Singapore's natural environment and present their findings through a video. Our team focused on popularisation of wildlife trade in Singapore from 1819-1945 and their presentation can be viewed at <https://drive.google.com/file/d/1rSlyXRmKRspfbwwwvcj7AtmcydUjgfs1/view?usp=sharing>.
- **GInnovation Challenge 2021** organised by North East CDC/POSB and supported by NEA, PUB and SIT – 2 of our Sec 1 Project Work teams emerged as the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Runners-up in this competition. Participants were to produce a video to raise awareness on environmental issues in the community and showcase their creative solutions. Our students focused on reducing food waste which was the theme in Sec 1 Project Work. The 1<sup>st</sup> Runner-up team comprised Deenise Tan, Clairia Tan, Cadence Wee and Derek Looi, all from 1E4 while the 2<sup>nd</sup> Runner-up team comprised Tan Gwen, Seraphina Toh and Matthew Hong, all from 1E3.
- **National Challenge Advocacy Competition 2021** organised by Crescent Girls' School – Our team of 4 student Cyber Wellness Ambassadors (Faun Loo 2N3, Sofia Teo 3E1, Nagarajan Gautham Karthik 3E5 and Tan Kwan Wei 3E5) achieved a Silver award among 70 participating primary and secondary schools. Participants were tasked to create a toolkit and outreach project to raise awareness of and guard against fake news
- **Revamp of study spaces in Sengkang Community Club** - 8 members of our Community Youth Leaders Club CCA participated in a focused group discussion organised by Sengkang CC in Oct 2021 and provided insightful feedback/suggestions. Sengkang CC's Study Room has been in operation since 2017 and widely used by students. We are glad that our students had contributed to the co-creation of better study spaces in the CC.
- **Boys Brigade Character Quest (Seniors Programme)** – Our 3 teams of BB boys achieved the Gold Honour Roll in this annual BB competition, among a total of 234 teams from 55 BB companies. The quest consisted of a theory assessment and a series of virtual tele-matches and our boys displayed perseverance and strong teamwork.

#### **Nominations for President's Award for Teachers (PAT) and Outstanding Youth in Education Award (OYEA)**

The PAT recognises experienced teachers for their dedication and hard work in developing our young. These teachers prepare students for life, as well as model commitment to continuous learning and enterprise. Nomination for PAT 2021 is open and will close on Tuesday, 25 Jan. The OYEA recognises excellent young teachers (35 years and younger) for their youthful idealism, energy, enthusiasm and active involvement in the development of youths. Nomination for OYEA 2021 is open and will close on Tuesday, 12 Jan.
